

Youth Scholarship Income Guidelines

UFM uses WIC guidelines as the cutoff for most scholarship funding. This is 185% of poverty guidelines. When the scholarship requests exceed available funding, priority funding of scholarships goes first to poverty level, then to 125% of poverty level, 150% of poverty level and finally 185% poverty level.
